SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHS: The children all had their school photograph taken yesterday morning. The children all came home with a slip of paper with a code so that you can access your child's image and order the photographs from Churchbury Photographic online. The photos will be uploaded in the next day or so, have a look over the weekend to see if they are there.

Please note that all orders done online will be delivered to the school in one go, we're waiting to find out the deadline and we'll let you know as soon as we have it.

SPECIAL MENU: The children really enjoyed their special menu on Thursday – they got to choose which shaped pasta they would like and then which sauce to go on top. There were lots of happy faces – and a fair amount of pasta sauce that needed to be wiped off chins! Look out for the next special menu day which will be coming up after half term.

OTHER NOTICES

UPCOMING SCHOOL TRIPS FOR YEARS ONE AND TWO: Next half term we have trips coming up for Years One and Two. The letters will come home to parents a couple of weeks before the trips to arrange the children's lunches, request a donation from parents and also parent volunteers. There is no need to do anything before you get these communications but we wanted to give you the dates and details now so you are aware in advance:

- Year One will be visiting the Toy Museum (V&A) in Bethnal Green on Thursday 16th November. We will be asking parents for a donation of £13.00 to cover the cost of the coaches (the self-led tour is free)
- Year Two will be visiting the RAF Museum in Colindale on Tuesday 28th November. We will be asking parents for a donation of £14.00 for this trip to cover the cost of the coaches and a special workshop "Fantastic Flight" that all the children will take part in.

Unfortunately, if we do not receive enough donations for these trips then other activities later in the year will have to be curtailed. We hope that by giving you plenty of warning that these trips will not cause a financial burden to our parents.

BARNET LIBRARIES: Following on from the reading workshop last week, one of our parents has kindly let us know about the great experience their family has with Barnet Libraries! This fantastic resource saves money and ensures that the children have a good selection of books to choose from.

All families living in Barnet can register at their local library (our nearest one is Golders Green). The library card is free (just take your ID and proof of address with you) and you can borrow books for free – they have a good range of reading scheme books as well as fiction books.

They also run an online service — which is highly recommended. They have a service called Select and Collect — this is online and you choose a book from a wide selection and choose which of the Barnet libraries you would like to collect the book from, and when the book is ready for collection you receive an email. You walk in the library, find your book (library staff place a paper with the person's name on it), borrow it from the machine using your card and it's done. They also email you a few days before the book is due to be returned. And in most cases you can renew online, and get another 2 weeks to keep the book (unless it's been reserved by somebody else). This means that you have a far wider range of books to choose from — and is particularly useful for older readers who can look and choose online for themselves.
