We have been finding the maths in everything we do, and we discovered that Maths is everywhere!

Please do encourage your child to talk to an adult at school if they need help, and please speak to a member of staff if your child expresses worries at home – we are on the gate every morning, or you can email us. The resources here also help the children to understand that it is NOT OK for someone to ask you to keep a secret about something that worries or upsets you.
