

## Parents Online Safety Acceptable Use Agreement

Children in school use various IT resources, including computers, tablets and internet software. We have very clear and strictly enforced policies in relation to child protection, safeguarding and e-safety. As a result, all parents and staff are expected to agree to an Acceptable Use Agreement committing to safe use of this technology on entry to the school.

### Acceptable Use Agreement:

- I grant permission for my child to have access to use the Internet and other computing facilities at school.
- I know that my child will be made aware of online-safety protocols within school. I will discuss the importance of these rules and support my child to use the internet appropriately.
- I accept that ultimately the school cannot be held responsible for the nature and content of materials accessed through the Internet and mobile technologies, but I understand that the school will take every reasonable precaution to keep pupils safe and to prevent pupils from accessing inappropriate materials. These steps include using an educationally filtered service, employing appropriate teaching practice and teaching online safety skills to pupils.
- I understand that the school can check my child's computer files, and the internet sites they visit while at school, and if they have concerns about their online safety or behaviour that they will contact me.
- I will support the school by promoting safe use of the Internet and digital technology at home and will inform the school if I have any concerns over my child's online-safety.
- I will keep all login details to all software packages used to support the children's learning and communication with parent's, safe and secure and not share them with others. *This includes, but is not limited to, the secure section of the website, Arbor, Tapestry, Collins e-Books and other online platforms used to support the children's learning where a username and password are provided by the school.*

Agreement is given when children start in our school through our online system Arbor within the consents section, which becomes active when children go on-roll in our school.
